We raised funds that the society is donating to the CDCC Traditional Art Show to be held in Corinella on the long weekend in June where we sponsor a prize for a painting of historical interest

February 19 - I spoke to 52 Grade 2s at Waverley Christian College in Narre Warren about the history of Narre Warren. This is my third year of talking to the Grade 2s at this school and it's always fun. Their Principal is also very interested in history generally, and has shared some of his collection of old maps and artefacts with the children and the gardener/handyman at the school has a collection of old tools which he has talked to the students about so they have had a broad overview of history.

March 9 - I presented my Digital Preservation and Outreach Education training to 16 staff from various Library Services at Pakenham Hall. We had undertaken the train-the-trainer sessions for this last year at the State Library. Overall six sessions took place all over Victoria. I did my presentation with Gareth Evens from the City of Greater Dandenong and Linda Longley and Justine Hanna from the City of Melbourne. It was a great experience – from being selected to participate, meeting and working with other Library staff, learning all about preserving digital content and then doing the presentations.

April 6 - I attended the City of Casey Heritage Advisory Committee meeting. We meet 3 times per annum. The City of Casey are revising their Heritage Strategy and are currently at the stage of Community Consultation.

April 11 - I spoke to the Berwick Legacy Ladies about 'Nineteenth century women in Casey and Cardinia' There were 13 in attendance - they were all very lovely.

April 18 - The Narre Warren & District Family History Group are hosting a series of seminars on different aspects of Genealogy. Lynne Bradley talked about the issue of Copyright and Creative Commons and I talked about Digital Preservation.

April 19 - I spoke to the Grade 2s at Thomas Mitchell Primary School in Endeavour Hills on the history of their area. 115 students in two sessions - it was just so much fun.

April 21 - I did some training on editing Wikipedia. I am not convinced that it is a totally authorative source but the premise behind the training is that Librarians are natural Wikipedians (accurate, able to use and cite the correct sources etc) and therefore more Librarians should be involved in the editing of this on-line encyclopaedia





Civic & Historical Societies Future Directions Committee

This committee has achieved its purpose, to provide adequate storage facilities for the City of Greater Dandenong Civic Collection, Springvale and Dandenong Historical Societies catalogued items. This new facility was officially launched and opened on 25 February by the Mayor Cr Heang Tak. The Civic Collection is currently shifting in with selected volunteers to scan and catalogue the items.

Dandenong Market 150th Celebrations

President Chris Keys is representing DDHS on a committee to formulate the celebrations for the Dandenong Market's 150th year. The committee includes the Board and Officers of the Dandenong Market, local traders, Multicultural Arts Victoria, Melbourne Food & Wine, Tourism Victoria and the City of Greater Dandenong.

<u>History of the Springvale Youth Club/ Springvale Community Centre/Springvale Learning and Activities</u> Centre (1944-2015)

In March 2015, Elena Sheldon, Manager of SLAC, approached DDHS for assistance in writing the history of the Centre. SLAC began at the end of 1944 as the Springvale Youth Club, changed its name to the Springvale Community Centre in 1983 when its focus widened and became the Springvale Learning & Activities Centre in 2007 to avoid confusion with other community organisations and services. Elena was initially asking us if we could refer her to a historian, but we took up the challenge ourselves, with Jenny Ferguson taking on the majority of the work. The *Dandenong Journal* proved to be the key primary source for the early history as minute books and annual reports were unavailable. The book will be launched on May 11 in Springvale.

And it's not really the gate takings or the book sales that motivate us to do the cemetery tours, it's the enormous amount of goodwill and publicity that the tours and the publications generate. In the end, it's certainly worth the trouble.

On the fundraising front, we were really happy with last month's sausage sizzle at Bunnings, even with a skeleton crew we walked away with nearly \$1,500 profit. 

S.E.H.A. Quarterly Report May 1st 2016

Another busy start to the year with an over abundant supply of emails which keeps the secretary and others wondering if we would have so much correspondence if we were still relying on Australia Post and the Postie! Many enquiries are Family History related, some we have been able to assist due to our large Local Papers collection but others we are often looking for "a pie in the sky".

Events and Activities

- Over some months there has been ongoing consultation with Bass Coast Shire for signage to explain the coal tramline and the historic Barlow Rails at Cape Paterson First Surf. These relate to the first coal mined in the area. The rails were exposed during excavation work at the end of last year. Their historical heritage is now being recognized as the signage is nearly completed.
- Reprinting of "The Golden Coast History of the Bunurong" by Bill Hayes is due to be completed in May 2016 and we will then set about organising a launch of this publication.
- Sam Gatto's book about Wonthaggi and WWI is at the final stages before going to the printer. This book looks likely to be launched in November at the latest.
- Wonthaggi's Rail Trail historical signage is at the graphic designer and we hope these signs will be erected at the "stations and significant locations" very soon. Consultants visited last week to discuss the placement of the signs.

- John Monash Science School, Year 12 Geography class of 40 students and four staff spent half a day at the Museum, with three of our members conducting an information and research lesson about the changes in the land use, the town centre, industry and housing as part of their unit of work for VCE assessment.
- Digital Wonthaggi via Google and GeoTours is getting some exposure. We, and the local library, are promoting this to visitors and schools.
- Donations, especially photographs, are coming thick and fast to the society and are being catalogued. It is amazing that we receive these from afar and that people are now looking to donate them.
- The monthly "Plod Essay" continues to be a "slice of history" that visitors and the community enjoy.
- Last week we had another consultancy meeting with the Bass Coast Shire about our West Wing extension. We await the Shire's Budget to determine the next steps to be taken.
- Open Days for the monthly Sunday Rotary Markets continue to bring in many visitors and provide revenue from the sale of local publications, postcards and second hand books.
- Advance bookings and programs are being organized for school visits, walks, bus tours. Both Primary and Secondary schools are involved and are planned for this Term.
- We have an Anzac/ WWI & WWII display at the Museum, including a list of WWI service men/women omitted from the Wonthaggi Cenotaph.
- Sam Gatto has again been asked to address the new Junior Constables at the Wonthaggi Police Station on May 31 about the social history of our town. Wonthaggi Probus has also engaged Sam as a speaker at their July meeting.

Taking History to all parts of the local community has been a huge focus of our society and we certainly see the value in this approach.
