We have had displays at both Pakenham and Berwick shows -also at Wilson Park on April 1st.

Queries are keeping me busy. The most often asked questions are about the Salvation Army Home after which Army Rd. and Army Settlement Rd. are named. In it's time it was a home for girls youth and old men. The establishment had 600acres of land much of which was covered by orchards. The first film was "Lasseter's bones", then a DVD "Pakenham to Pozieres", and now another film about Lasseter is in the making..

Some people have been back to the museum as much as four times. I asked one man what occupation he had before retiring. He said he was in IT. I told him of the problem we had with "In Magic " and he said he would have a look at it. The result is that now our catalogue is in Microsoft Excel. No charge.

We are having trouble with reporting our meetings in the Gazette. Half the time they are not reported, and the last for May 5th was listed as May 3rd. And also in the wrong venue.Our speaker is Neil Lucas, and his subject "Christmas and Cocos Islands" where he was administrator for some years.

We have ordered a reprint of "Berwick Nostalgia" and I have applied for a grant from Casy Council. This is the second reprint.

What been happening this year?

The Archive, the Narre Warren & District Family History Group and myself are all re-locating to a new home in the Cranbourne Library Complex in June. This is because a new Narre Warren Library and City of Casey offices are currently being constructed (along with a gallery and theatre) and our current building will be demolished. The new complex is called Bunjil Place and is a \$125 million project. So there will be busy times ahead.

On February 21, I did a talk to 55 Grade 5 & 6 students at Tulliallan Primary School in Cranbourne North. It's a new school, only opened this year. The school is on land occupied by the Tulliallan property, which had connections to the Rossiter family, Charles Rossiter is the namesake of Rossiter Road in Koo-Wee-Rup, and the Gibb family, who owned Melville Park (later called Edrington and the home of Lord and Lady Casey) in Berwick. On March 20, I spoke to 7 women from the Narre Warren Legacy Widows, about the history of Narre Warren. Their numbers are declining as many of these women are in their 80s and find it hard to get out and attend meetings.

On April 24, I co-presented a seminar with Lynne and Jane from the Narre Warren & District Family History Group on 'Untangling the web' - it was an informal question and answer session about maximising your Internet research results.

On April 26, I spoke to the Grade 2s at Berwick Lodge Primary School on the history of Berwick. 200 children all up, eight separate sessions. I was exhausted by the time I got back to work!

On April 27, I spoke to 122 Grade 1s and 2s at Thomas Mitchell Primary School in Endeavour Hills, on the history of their area. That was only 2 sessions.

On May 1, I presented a seminar 'Discover Lost Melbourne on the Net'. Only four people came, but we had a fun time, so that's all the matters! If you are interested, I have all the links on our blog http://caseycardinialinkstoourpast.blogspot.com.au/2017/05/historic-melbourne-and-victoria-on.html










On March 19, we visited Balla Balla homestead, at Cannons Creek. The homestead was built 1870s/early 1880s. It is on the City of Casey Heritage Scheme and is considered to be 'architecturally and aesthetically significant as a relatively intact example of an early dwelling in in the now rare Colonial Georgian style'.

The Pearcedale Public Hall is celebrating its 100th birthday this year. The ceremony will probably be in August.

Staff from the City of Casey have visited the museum with a view to improve security and storage. They will endeavor to improve external security lighting especially at the front and rear of the site. We will possibly get an internal wireless system to cover the interior of the museum. The air conditioner in the school will also be upgraded. The storage of the Shire of Cranbourne books and papers was discussed and some will be digitized by the City of Casey. It may be possible that we can get a fireproof safe and a compactus depending on their size. We will not be required to pay for any of these changes.

Christmas in July will be a luncheon on Sunday, July 23rd at the Tooradin Sports Club. The speaker will be Geoff Whiffen who is Chairman and a Life Member of Cranbourne Turf Club. He will talk on the history of the race track which is celebrating its 150th anniversary this year. More details to follow.

REPORT TO SEHA MEETING ON SUNDAY 7 MAY 2017 Hosted by Dandenong & District Historical Society

SEHA MEETING DETAILS: The meeting commences at 11.00am with a tour of the City of Greater Dandenong Archive Centre, 66 Hammond Road, Dandenong. There will be a tour of the Archive, which contains material from the City of Dandenong, City of Springvale and the two historical societies. Lunch is scheduled at the Albion Hotel at 12.15ish.

Today's meeting takes place at the Dandenong & District Historical Society <u>new rooms at 39 Clow Street in Dandenong</u>. Meeting will start at 2.00pm. There are some access issues to the Historical Society rooms on a Sunday- it has to be via a fire escape at the rear of the building. They are on the 1st floor, so delegates will have to climb one flight of stairs. If delegates assemble near the "Public Entrance" door at the back of the building they can be escorted into the building via the fire escape.



REPORT FOR S.E.H.A. MEETING 7TH May, 2017.

For our first meeting in 2017, we had as our guest Mr. Frank Keighery. We were shown a recording of the Last Post Ceremony at The Australian War Memorial which honoured Private Frank Keighery, the first man from Lang Lang to enlist for WW1.

For our March meeting, we met at the Lang Lang Cemetery for a descriptive tour of some of the historical graves. The event was well attended, with a few non-members joining us for the afternoon.

Bob Taylor, the last Station Master in Lang Lang, joined us for our April meeting and shared some of his memories of his time working for the railways. He also provided some early photos of local stations.

For Anzac Day, the Society provided a Display in the Lang RSL Clubrooms showcasing the local men who enlisted from Lang Lang for WW1, but did not return. A separate book was made for each of the soldiers showing their war history and jottings from the local paper at the time.

Following our Cemetery tour, we thought it important that the first grave dug in Lang Lang should be marked. We have been working in conjunction with the Lang Lang Cemetery Trust and together, we are arranging for a plaque to be made. The first burial was for Louisa Mary Pickersgill who died 31st October, 1886 aged two years.

We will have a small gathering to unveil the plaque followed by an afternoon tea.

We have been lucky to obtain the original Certificate of Title for the land of the Yannathan Union Church, dated 27th June, 1904...The Church land was surveyed in the last week of October, 1890 on the land of Joseph Carson. The Church was built and officially opened on December 19th, 1890. The Title transfers the land to the Trustees of the Church. These nine Trustees read as a Who's Who of the original settlers of Yannathan.

We have also obtained a photo of Mr. James Baker, one of Lang Lang's original settlers, and a very important person in the growth of our town.
