Talks to Schools and Community Groups

September 9 - I was the guest speaker at the Narre Warren & District Family History Group's inaugural meeting at the Cranbourne Library. I spoke about the history of the Cranbourne Library site. The land was originally part of the Mayune Run leased by the Ruffy Brothers from around 1836 and, from 1851, part of the *Mayfield* property owned by Alexander Cameron. Fast forwarding to 1982 the Sperry New Holland factory opened on the site. After their closure the site was purchased by the Shire of Cranbourne in 1994 and the Cranbourne Library opened in the old Administration building in 1996. We had a good turn up of 30 people.

On September 27, I spoke about the history of Pakenham to 50 people at the Evergreen Retirement Village at Pakenham. The Activities Co-ordinator is very organised and invited the local paper, the *Pakenham Gazette*, to cover the occasion which they did very comprehensively. Unfortunately for me I had made a mistake about the origin of a local hotel, this was reported and I then had three people (very politely) ring me up to tell me I was wrong! Anyway, I did some more research, wrote another story for the paper which they published and I must have got it right as I had no other complaints!

On October 16, I presented at the Narre Warren & District Family History Group's (NWDFHG) all day seminar. The seminar covered three topics - 'You can learn a lot in a cemetery', 'Finding records at PROV' and 'How Historical Societies can help you with your family history'. It was this last topic that I presented.

On November 1, Lynne Bradley from the NWDFHG and I spoke to 13 people at the Evergreen Retirement Village in Pakenham on 'Tracing your family tree'

Local History and Family History launch

On October 17, we had an official launch to celebrate the relocation of the Narre Warren & District Family History Group and the Local History Archive (which I manage) from the Narre Warren Library to the Cranbourne Library. We had 35 people attend including many representatives from the members of the Local History Reference Group. The official honour was undertaken by the Mayor of the Cardinia Shire, Cr Brett Owen. The *Pakenham Gazette* gave us a good write up as well.

The Victoria Cross: Australia Remembers

On November 2, the Cranbourne Library had Michael Madden as a guest speaker. He is the author of the forthcoming publication, *The Victoria Cross: Australia Remembers*. The book covers the lives of the 100 Australian recipients of Victoria Cross. Michael has done extensive research into the recipients and has managed to track down a number of family members to get personal perspectives on their lives. Has even travelled to England to see the prototype of the Victoria Cross, held in the Queen's private collection at Buckingham Palace and interviewed the jewellers at Hancocks in London who have been responsible for making the medals since 1856. This was done eventually. It is now used as our Museum.



Our major project for this year is to produce a quality booklet, to be produced and distributed free to all residents of the town. It will be a potted history of the town over the time between gazetting of the first Post Office in Tobin Yallock in 1878, to the present day. A period of 140 years, split into chapters of 20-year time spans. The drafting, revisions and tinkering of this has been time consuming, frustrating rewarding to see it all come together. It is now at the printers and we should have it back by the end of the month. We would like to thank the "Friends of the Memorial Hall Op-Shop" for the grant given to us for the costs associated in producing this book and distributing it for free.

With 1000 copies printed, the Lang Lang Post Office will be delivering them to every property in the town and surrounding areas in

the 3984 postcode area in mid to late January. Extra copies if required, will be available at a small cost from the Society. This booklet was inspired as a part of our 20th Anniversary celebrations, coming up in April 2018. Further events are being planned and details will follow they are finalised.

We held our AGM last month, with no changes in the Executive positions, Jean Hayden, Peter Hayden and Joy Adderley remain President, Secretary and Treasurer respectively. There were a few changes to the Committee members.

We have recently mounted a flagpole in the gardens outside the Display Centre which looks pretty good and adds some balance to the garden and building.

We are also awaiting the outcome of a Heritage Grants application to the Cardinia Shire. This will enable us to repair all the cracks, holes and blemishes in the walls and ceilings, then repaint the interior of our Centre.

Over the last couple of years, Jean has been amassing photos of the historic farm houses around the district and we have been attempting to collate them into a video display. This has dragged on and been put on the back burner numerous times as other projects keep taking priority. It is now coming to fruition with the production of a PowerPoint display which we are now running on the TV in the Centre. In two parts for the farm houses and homes in the town itself. It runs as a series of "Then and Now" photographs and relevant captions showing the changes that time, and changes of ownership have wrought. The final stage is to get all on a CD/DVD that will play on any TV or computer, so it may be distributed to all the relevant home owners.

The Society is having its Christmas break-up at The Palace Hotel on November 21st. The Centre will be closed over December and January, but the "by appointment " openings will still operate if needed. Normal open hours will resume the first Wednesday in February.


