### Cranbourne Shire 150th anniversary celebration

We lent the City of Casey some items for their 150th anniversary of the establishment of the Cranbourne Shire function held on February 24, 2018 at Greg Clydesdale Square in Cranbourne. There was the display of our material and old photos, a birthday cake, community displays and official speeches led by Cr Amanda Stapledon. It went very well.

### Visitors to the Museum

We have had reasonable numbers visiting the cottage since the New Year. We also had a group visit from an After-School group of 16 children in January and a visit from Balwyn Evergreen Seniors on February 13.

### Cranbourne Garden Club talk

Barry and Polly Freeman visited the Cranbourne Garden Club and took some of our collection to show them. The talk went very well and we were very pleased to receive a donation of \$50.00.

### Visit to Tyabb Aircraft Museum

We had a trip to Judy Pay's private Aircraft Museum at Tyabb on March 25. We had booked two Bendigo Bank buses which can carry up to 24 people between them. Our guide, Stan at the age of 86, was very sprightly and knowledgeable and his wife Pat, at 83, also enjoyed working at the museum.

### City of Casey contamination project

The City of Casey is working on a project to locate sources of possible historic ground contamination in the area. They have been looking through some of our old records to try to locate the sites of old tips, land fill, petrol stations etc. The Council does not want a repeat of the Brookland Greens fiasco where a housing estate was allowed to be built on an old land fill site in Cranbourne and the residents subsequently found high levels of methane gas in their houses. A class action saw the Council and the EPA have to pay out \$23.5million in damages in 2011.

### Casey Cardinia Heritage Festival

We participated in the Casey Cardinia Heritage Festival held at the Upper Beaconsfield Hall on Sunday May 6. Polly and Barry had their display of old tools and utensils and people had a great time trying to guess what they were originally used for. The day was very successful.

## Report to the SEHA quarterly meeting held at the Chelsea RSL on Sunday 20 May 2018

## SEHA REPORT, MAY 2018

Since our last report, the Centre has been painted with the assistance of a Heritage Grant from the Cardinia Shire. The contractor let us down a bit by not being able to start until late January which delayed the reopening until the second week in February. A big thanks to the local **Fire Brigade** for assembling all the shelving units in the archive room for us which was a big job well done.

We have assembled all the photos from our various open days, and special events into movies that we show at the Centre whenever it is open. These include our 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, the 109<sup>th</sup> Annual Flower show, the ANZAC memorial plaque, Jean's Historic Homes show, and several others.

We held a raffle as part of the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. The prize was a framed copy of the 1895 Walter Foreman land auction poster. Many of the local men were keen to win so they could display it in their man caves. It was won by our own **Jacquie Laidlaw**.

The main event for our 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary was on April 29<sup>th</sup> and was a short tour of the older areas of the town in a horse drawn Landau. The horses and carriage were supplied by **Unique Carriages** from Bunyip, who also gave us a very generous discount on the usual price. Without this discount we would not have been able to proceed with the event.



The weather was perfect, and the people kept coming, commencing at 11:00 am the last ride was called at 3:00 pm by the operators, when there were just three people still waiting. At that stage about 75 adults plus children had enjoyed the ride. We supplied sandwiches, cakes and a cuppa for all. Every person received a sheet with the route map and an explanation of the things that they should be looking for as they proceeded around the town.

There will be another calendar coming out for 2019 and hopefully a new web site. More about those later.

## SEHA report 20/5/2018

### Casey Cardinia Heritage Festival 2018

The Casey Cardinia Heritage Festival was held at the Upper Beaconsfield Hall on Sunday, May 6, 2018 from 10.00am to 3.00pm.

The Festival was part of the National Trust Heritage Festival whose theme was 'My Culture, My Story'. As our region was celebrating the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of the Shire of Cranbourne and Shire of Berwick in 1868, we interpreted this theme as '150 stories of our Past'

The History and Heritage Groups in the region wrote 150 stories that reflected some aspect of the history of the area. We set the story length at 150 words, but if it fitted on an A4 page with a photograph, that was fine. We had a great variety of stories covering nearly every town in the Casey Cardinia region, different time spans and because we had a variety of writers we covered a range of topics including sport, industry, local government, women, education, religion, farming and the list goes on.

We had the 150 stories on display at the Heritage Festival and we will work with Casey Cardinia Libraries to see if we can get an on-line version of the stories.

The Mayor of the Cardinia Shire, Cr Collin Ross, officially opened the Festival at 11.30am. The Upper Beaconsfield CWA provided the catering and the Billabong Band performed authentic Australian folk music in the afternoon.

Every group that attended had a great day talking to people, but it's not just the fact that we can tell people about the history of our area, it's that we all learn new information, get new contacts, see new historical photos we haven't seen before. The day is really about sharing our history and it was a total success!

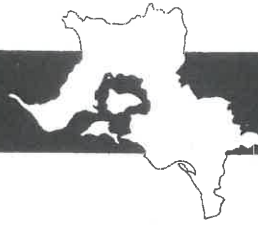

The Society has just celebrated caring for Ballam Park homestead for 50 years - when they took an interest in the building in 1965 it was two weeks away from demolition and the next three years were spent fundraising to save the house and have it open to the public.

- The March 2018 *Raves from the Graves* has a report on the deliberately lit on an open area behind the Cemetery. There was substantial damage to some graves due to burnt trees falling on them. The back fence was also damaged leading to unwelcome trespassers. Many graves are also smoke covered and hopefully this will be removed by rain. One of the issues is that graves are owned by the family not the Cemetery Trust, so unless a kind insurance company steps in and repairs the graves, the work will have to wait for the grave owners.
- There is an article by Rosemary Reddick on the O'Mara family - James and William drowned after a boating accident in 1901. In 1918 another brother, George, also lost his life in a boating accident. They are buried at Cheltenham. There is also an article on Lucy Eveline Wawn, who drowned at Mordialloc Sea Baths in 1894 at the age of 17.

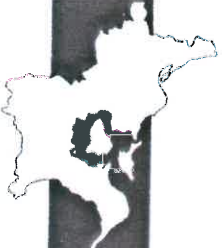
